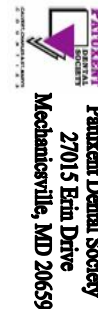

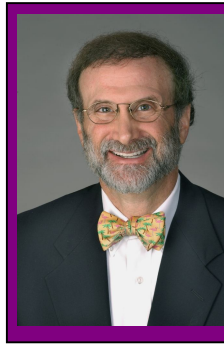

Dr. Svirsky has developed a broad background in research, published numerous articles in the dental literature, and earned a master's degree in adult education. He is a sought after speaker with an international reputation as an informative and entertaining lecturer.

He received an outstanding facility award from the American College of Dentists. The ADA awarded him their Presidential Citation of significant contributions to the oral health of the public and the profession of Dentistry. Dr. Svirsky is honorary member of the Thomas P. Hinman Dental Society and a Director at the Scottsdale Center for Dentistry.

**From Baltimore:** Take Route 97 South to Route 50/301 South; take Route 301 South at the Bowie exit; follow 301 South to Waldorf. Once in Waldorf, turn left onto Route 5 South, which turns into 235 South. Stay on Route 235 (Three Notch Road) South to Lexington Park. The Conference Center and Hotel are on the right, located just past Gate 1 Patuxent River Naval Air Station; take the second right after Pegg Road (immediately following Fairfield Inn by Marriott Sign). If you miss the turn, take a right onto Valley Drive and make the first right into the Conference Center parking lot.

**From Washington:** Take Route 5 South from the Beltway to Route 301 South to Waldorf. Once in Waldorf, turn left onto Route 5 South, which turns into 235 South. Stay on Route 235 (Three Notch Road) South to Lexington Park. The Conference Center and Hotel are on the right, located just past Gate 1 Patuxent River Naval Air Station; take the second right after Pegg Road (immediately following Fairfield Inn by Marriott Sign). If you miss the turn, take a right onto Valley Drive and make the first right into the Conference Center parking lot.
